WESTERN PRESIDENTS' MONTHLY MEETINGS - Nina Logan

At the Zoom meetings of the Western Presidents, which both Jim Ryan and I attend, we learn a lot about the other clubs in Western Canada. It is very good to be able to meet each other on Zoom and have a chance to share what clubs are doing. We also get information from Gail Keely of FFManitoba, our Western Club President. She keeps us to date with the latest information from FFI. The following is an article which explains the updated FFI Ambassador Coordinator Discount. This is a really good incentive for those who are willing to help out their club by organizing a journey.

At our meeting in May I mentioned that Allison (our liaison in FFI) had indicated that journey coordinator benefits which were previously given only for international journeys by FFI are now offered for all journeys. I have been asked what the FFI journey coordinator benefits are. If you go to the help centre in the member portal at the website for Friendship Force International and type in ambassador coordinator discount you will see the policy I have copied below.

What's the Ambassador Coordinator discount?

The Ambassador Coordinator will receive a discount on their FFI fee if the journey is filled to a certain percentage:

100% of hosting capacity: coordinator receives a 100% credit of the FFI Ambassador Fee

95% of hosting capacity: coordinator receives a 95% credit of the FFI Ambassador Fee

90% of hosting capacity: coordinator receives a 90% credit of the FFI Ambassador Fee

85% of hosting capacity: coordinator receives an 85% credit of the FFI Ambassador Fee

80% of hosting capacity: coordinator receives an 80% credit of the FFI Ambassador Fee

75% of hosting capacity: coordinator receives a 75% credit of the FFI Ambassador Fee

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The Ambassador Coordinator discount is valid for Club-to-Club Journeys as well as Special Journeys.

Please contact the staff member responsible for your journey.

At our last field rep meeting Allison indicated that the new website is now "live" and is meant to be a website for the general public. The member portal now contains the listing of journeys and all the policies, virtual experiences and any other information specifically for members. Much of the information is still only in English but other languages will be added as the translations are finished.

Everyone is encouraged to use the help center in the member portal and if there are any difficulties in finding specific information use the report a bug feature to let FFI know.

The relevant Newsletter will be coming out every second month with links to the website for specific information.
